Introduction

Samaanta Foundation is a Nepal-based not-for-profit organization that promotes equality and empowerment by providing quality higher education opportunities to meritorious public school graduates from poor socio-economic backgrounds. The Foundation provides comprehensive Fellowships which cover tuition fees, accommodation, and any other related expenses including transportation, uniform, lab and exam fees as well as mentorship and other extra-curricular support.

Overview

The past six months at Samaanta Foundation have been busy and productive. The Fellows have shown their commitment to Paying it Forward, successfully organizing this year's Fundraising Campaign. They worked together really well and raised US\$5300 against a target of US\$4,000.

11 of the 12 fellows from the 10th cohort have been selected to continue their Samaanta Fellowship. Manoj Bisunke has become the first Samaanta Fellow to pursue Engineering. Two more Fellows, Dila KC and Upahar Rai, have received full scholarships to attend the Asian University for Women in Bangladesh.

Two fellows each from the fifth and the sixth cohort have graduated from King's College and Thames International College with excellent results.

Partnerships

Rachita Shrestha (8th Cohort) and Shubhalkshya Tamang (10th Cohort) have been enrolled at Kathmandu University for B.Sc. in Environmental Science and B.Sc. in Applied Physics respectively. Through their enrolment, we have established a partnership with Kathmandu University (KU), one of Nepal's leading universities, to facilitate higher education for deserving students.

We have also entered a formal partnership with King's College to support our Fellows. These partnerships put us in good stead to provide meaningful opportunities for our senior Fellows.

10th Cohort Placements

Samaanta Foundation's 10th Cohort completed their 12th grade examinations. 9 out of the 12 Fellows have been selected to pursue their Undergraduate studies in Nepal. This is the highest number of Fellows from a single cohort that have been selected for further studies. Two more Fellows have been accepted to continue their higher education on full scholarships in Bangladesh, capping the remarkable performance of the cohort. Fellow-led Fundraising Campaign

Every year, Fellows come together to raise funds to support one more deserving Fellow from a disadvantaged community in Nepal. This year, the Fellows launched a local and social media fundraising event in which individuals or groups could donate any amount of money to the Foundation. This would also help raise the Foundation's profile.

The One More Fellow Campaign is built on the principle of "Paying It Forward". Our Fellows strongly believe that the opportunity provided to them by the Foundation transformed their lives. This was an entirely Fellow-Led initiative to fund at least one more deserving candidate in the 2024 cohort.

Fellows organized themselves into teams and reached out to different organizations, companies, colleges and groups to promote the campaign. They raised a total of \$5,260 over a three-month period. As part of the fundraiser, the Fellows led a 'Deusi Bhailo Program' during the Tihar festival, where the Fellows went to the homes and offices of several well-wishers of Samaanta Foundation to play Deusi Bhailo, celebrate the festival, and raise funds.

Meet and Greet Ceremony

Samaanta Foundation Fellows hosted a Meet and Greet Ceremony to celebrate the success of the Fundraising Campaign and 12 years of the Samaanta Journey on the 23rd of December 2023. The event gathered our Fellows, alumni, partners, friends, family and well-wishers of Samaanta to appreciate their love and support. It was a grand success!

Extracurricular Activities

At Samaanta, we are committed to the overall development of our Fellows and continue to emphasize extracurricular activities. We present some highlights below.

Community Engagements: Two of our Fellows from the 11th Cohort, Suraj Mandal and Rabin Neupane, facilitated interesting sessions at their respective communities demonstrating the principle of "Paying It Forward" in action. During the Dashain festival, Suraj hosted a session on the topic "What after SEE," where he provided insights into choosing the right academic stream after the 10th grade and shared information on exploring scholarships and other learning opportunities. Rabin organized an afforestation program in his village, involving the Child Club that he had established last year.

Women Lead: Deepa Amgai, Ranjita Sarki, Shobha Adhikari and Dila KC from the 10th Cohort completed a year-long WomenLEAD Leadership Training Program in the summer of 2023. The course provides young women with intensive leadership training, skills-building opportunities, mentoring, a peer-support network, and university preparation. The Course trains 30 young women annually, who in turn train another 450 students in their schools and communities using the tools provided through the School Leadership Program. So far, 14 Samaanta Fellows have completed Women Lead fellowships.

Aakar Nepal: Eleven Fellows of the 11th cohort completed a 3-month long summer program organized by Aakar Nepal. Aakar Nepal is a Pestalozzi Development Fund-supported project aimed towards interest and confidence building among Nepali youth to design and implement solutions to problems in their community. For each participant, a professional mentor is assigned for the duration of the project. Fellows conducted various programs such as awareness programs on women's reproductive health, afforestation programs, and cancer awareness and consultations as their project. This is the second year Samaanta Fellows have played a critical role in the success of Aakar Nepal's summer program.

Finances

In the next academic year (July 2024 – June 2025), we plan to i) expand the number of Fellows we recruit to 20, and ii) rent a bigger office. Each year, the number of eligible outstanding students is much higher than the Fellowships we can offer given the financial constraints we face, with financial resources as the primary limitation. Our current office is not large enough anymore to hold all our Fellows at the same time, which makes programming difficult.

Accounting for 20 new Fellows in the 13th cohort and a budget for renting a larger, more adequate office space, the estimated expense for the current academic 2024-25 (Jul 2024- Jun 2025) is US\$165,000. The following table presents the pledged and/or anticipated funds from our current partners for the coming year, indicating a resource gap of USD 52,000. We will look to cover this gap over the next few months. Additional resources would also enable us to deepen the Fellowship. This could include providing adequate laptops for our Fellows and expanding our programs.
